




The Last Professors: The Corporate University and the Fate of the Humanities, With a New Introduction (Paperback)

The fate of the professor, Donoghue shows, has always been tied to that of the liberal arts -with the humanities at its core. The rise to prominence of the American university has been defined by the strength of the humanities and by the central role of the autonomous, tenured professor who can be both scholar...
